REGULATIONS**

General Code of Conduct

- Students have to attend classes regularly.
- Irregular attendance, indifference in regard to class work and examination, discourtesy towards teachers, insubordination, obscenity in word and act, willful damage to College property, anti-social activities, are liable for disciplinary action which includes expulsion from the College.
- In case of leave or absence of students from the lectures, a leave application shall be filed by students in presence of their parents, duly signed by the class coordinator, subject faculties, HODs and Director.
- 80% attendance is mandatory.
- In case of events, attendance shall be ensured by the students with the event coordinator each day.

Disciplinary Rules

- Students shall compulsorily carry their identity cards daily.
- Students must complete their assignments and projects before the deadline.
- The behaviour of the students, both within and outside the college premises should be decent and befitting to a professional institution.
- Students shall follow the parking rules.
- Students found guilty of ragging will be dismissed from the college as per the Supreme Court ruling.

Mid-Term Examination:

- iv. **One Mid-Term examination shall be conducted or if two Mid-Term examinations shall be conducted in the semester and weightage** shall be given either best of two or average of two Mid-Term examinations or as per the concern Board of Studies.

End-Term Examination

- i. The End-Term examination will be conducted by Examination section.
- ii. The duration of end-term examination shall be 2½ to 3 hours.
- iii. The weightage of End-Term examination shall be 60%.

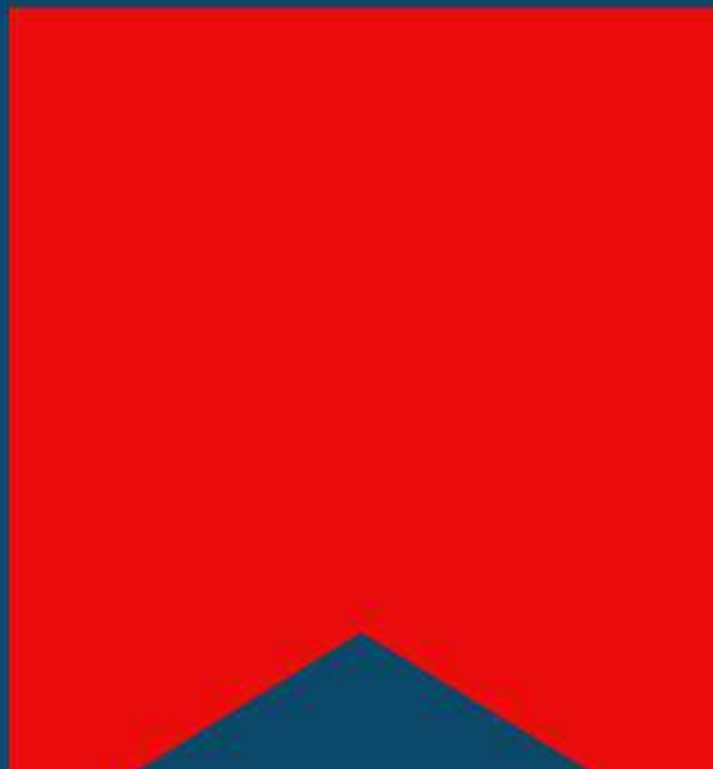

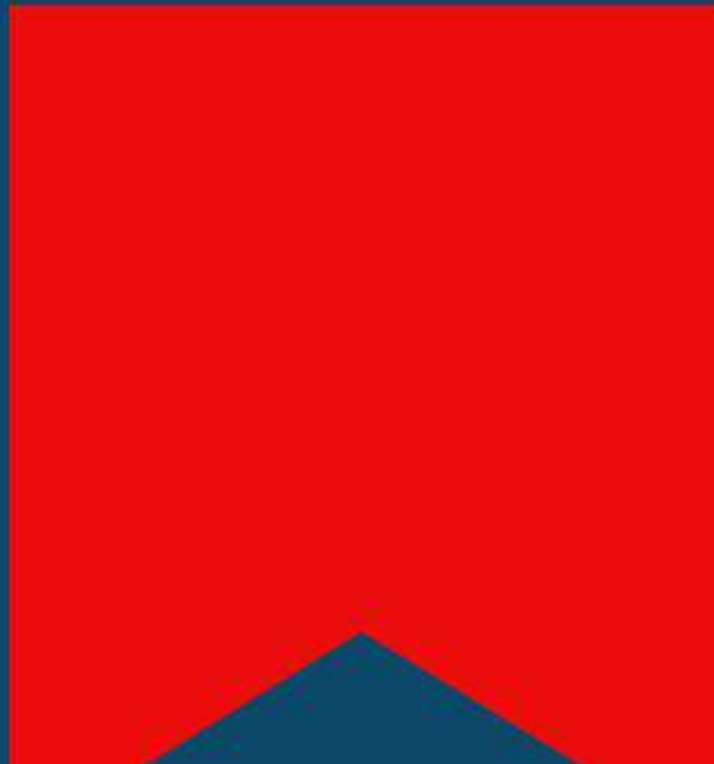
