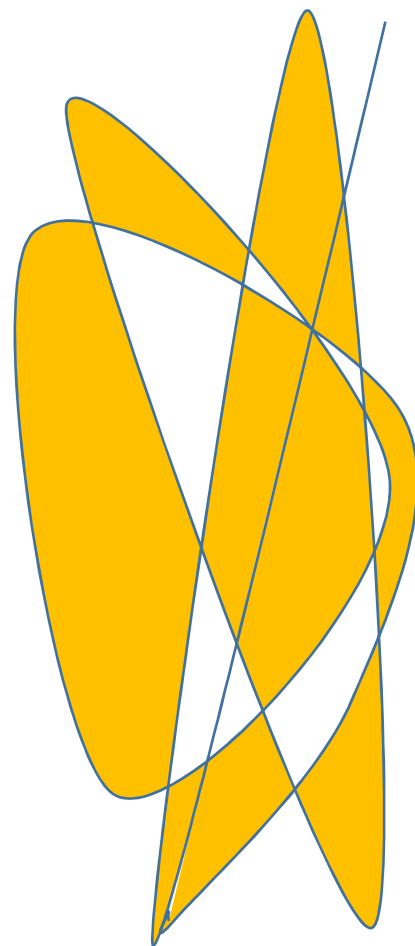

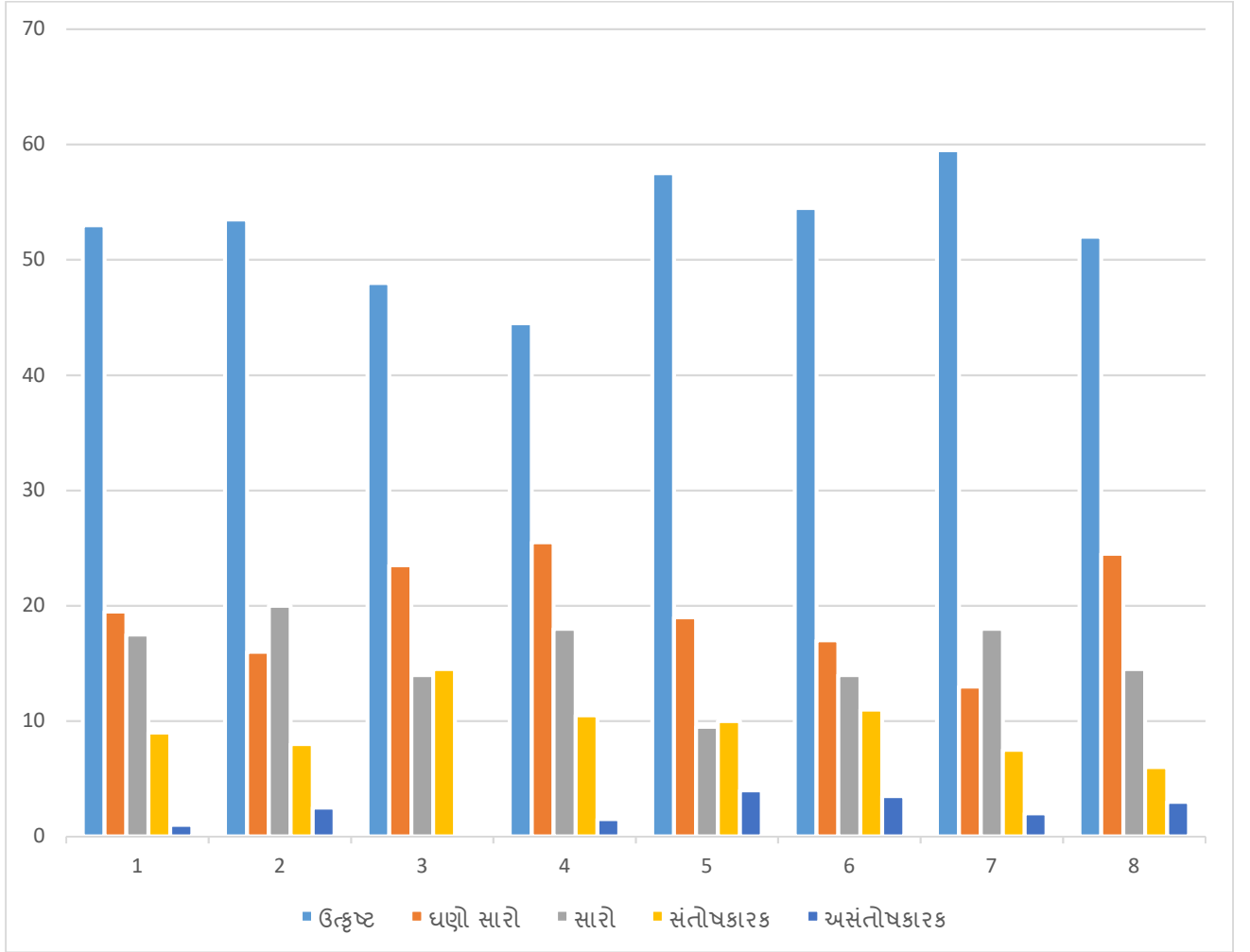

- Student enrollment and profile (including reservation policies – Category wise admission ratio)

B.Ed. Admission Policy : 2024-25**Rules related to eligibility:**

- Candidates who have passed graduation degree (B.A,B.Com.B.Sc.,B.B.A.,B.C.A.) of the pattern 10+2+3 from any U.G.C recognised university/post graduate degree (M.A,M.Com.M.Sc.,M.B.A.,M.C.A.) with minimum 50% (SC, ST Candidates 45% marks) of total marks according to NCTE norms are eligible for the admission in B.Ed course.
- Candidates having engineering degree with minimum 55% marks will be eligible for admission in B.Ed. Course.
- Number of Candidates in the college will be according to, rules of University, Gujarat Government and NCTE applicable as per the time.

Subject Method Selection:

- Candidates who have completed graduation in Sociology or Philosophy will be eligible for getting admission in Social Science.
- First subject will be given at the time of Admission from university and second subject will be decided by the college. In this context decision of college will be final.
- Subject can be chosen according to the main subject mentioned in the mark sheet at graduate or post graduate level.

Merit-Based:

- Admission is usually based on merit, considering marks obtained in the qualifying examination.
- **Reservation:**

Reservation of seats for SC- 7%, ST-15%, OBC-27%, EWS-10% candidates is as per existing government rules.

Admission Procedure:

- **Direct Admission:**

Direct admission based on merit, without an entrance exam.

- **Counseling:**

Selected candidates are called for counseling to complete the admission process.
Important Points:

- **NCTE Guidelines:**

The National Council for Teacher Education (NCTE) sets the guidelines for teacher education programs, including B.Ed.

- **2-Year B.Ed Program:**

The NCTE has announced the reintroduction of a two year B.Ed program, starting from the 2015-16 academic session.

Grade Conversion:

If grades are mentioned in the mark sheet, candidates must produce the rules for converting grades into percentages or get the grades converted by their university.

Admission Process:

- **Online Registration:** The admission process is conducted online Registration for apply B.Ed. Course
- **Merit List:** Admission will be based on a merit list prepared by the Bhagwan Mahvir University
- **Document Verification:** Candidates will need to undergo document verification.

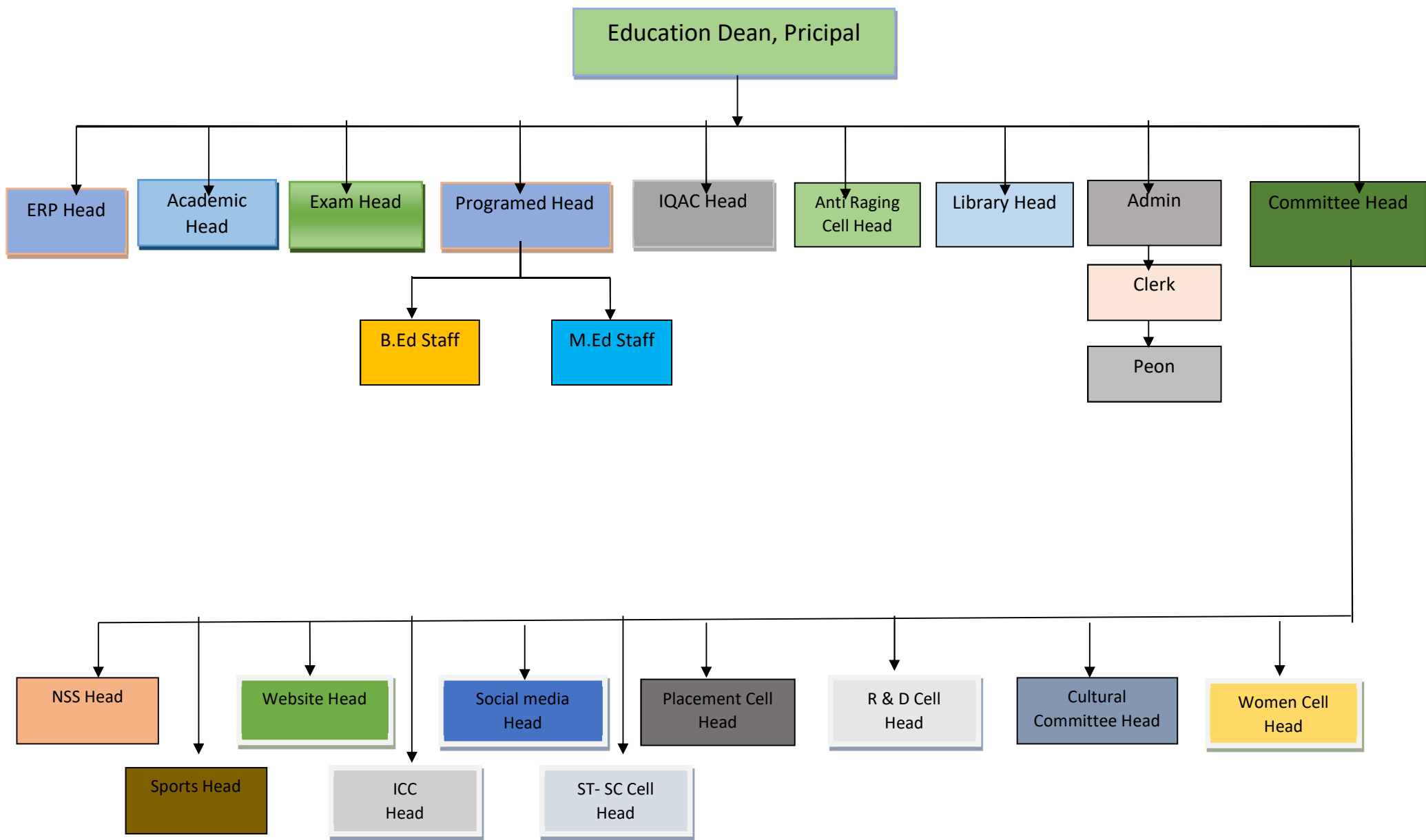

7. Innovations and Best Practices

Best Practices Teaching MICRO TEACHING SKILLS BASED LEARNING (MTL)

2. Objectives of the Practice

- ☐ To enable teacher trainees to learn and assimilate new teaching skills under controlled conditions.
- ☐ To enable teacher trainees to master a number of teaching skills.
- ☐ To enable teacher trainees to gain confidence in teaching.
- ☐ To switch the teaching behaviors within the needed manner.
- ☐ To modify the teaching method to achieve perfection in teaching.

3. The Context

Microteaching is a teacher training technique for learning teaching skills. It employs real teaching situation for developing skills and helps to get deeper knowledge regarding the art of teaching. This Stanford technique involved the steps of “plan, teach, observe, reevaluated as the core component in 91% of on development programs, with the significant reduction in the teaching complexities with respect to number of students in a and timeframe, etc.[3,4,5,6,7,8] Most of the pre programs widely use microteaching, and it is a proven method to attain gross improvement in the instructional experiences.[9] Effective student teaching should be the prime quality of a teacher. As an innovative method of equipping teachers to be effective, skills and practices of microteaching have been implemented.[10] The Practice(400 words)

4. The Practice

The student teachers should practice a particular skill to the satisfaction of the observers.

Providing feedback: The performed micro lesson should be followed by the feedback for knowing not only the mistakes but also modifications in that lesson.

Re-planning: After the feedback on the performed micro lesson, the student – teacher should re-plan the same or different micro lesson by including the suggestions of the observers.

Re-teaching: Re-planned micro lessons should be taught to the same or other groups of students consisting of five to ten students.

Providing re-feedback: Feedback is given again in the re-teaching of a micro lesson as re-feedback. The practice should be continued until the observers are satisfied with the skill achieved.

Integration of teaching skills**5. Evidence of Success :**

- ☐ Microteaching is a highly individualized training device
- ☐ Microteaching is an experiment in the field of teacher education which has been incorporated in the practice teaching schedule
- ☐ It is a student teaching skill training technique and not a teaching technique or method
- ☐ Microteaching is micro in the sense that it scale down the complexities of real teaching
- ☐ Practicing one skill at a time
- ☐ Reducing the class size to 5 – 10 students/ Trainees
- ☐ Reducing the duration of lesson to 7 -10 minutes
- ☐ Limiting the content to a single concept
- ☐ immediate feedback helps in improving, fixing and motivating
- ☐ The student are providing immediate feedback in terms of peer group feedback, Mobile recorded/CCTV
